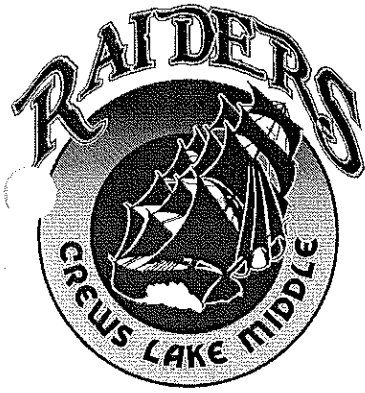

Dear Parents,

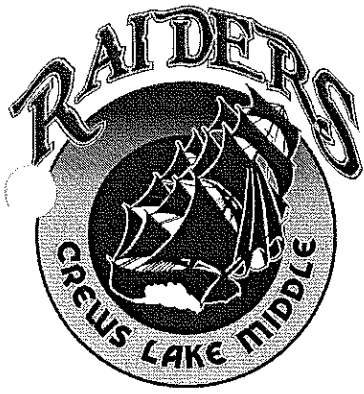

As a Title 1 school, we are required to inform you when a teacher, for four or more consecutive week, does not meet certification requirements.

What is Title 1?

- Federally funded program to improve schools with high percentages of students in poverty determined by rates of students receiving free and reduced lunches
- Provides supplemental supports and services

What are some ways we use Title 1 funds?

- Professional development for teachers
- Additional instructional materials, resources, technology, etc.
- Parent information nights

What is my child expected to learn?

- All students are expected to learn their grade level Florida Standards or Next Generation Sunshine State Standards (Science, Social Studies)
- Students who need support to achieve grade-level expectations may receive interventions through differentiated instruction in class or intervention homerooms
- Students who need advancement also receive differentiated instruction and are assigned to enrichment homerooms



How do I know if my child is making progress?

- Monitoring your child's assignments and grades in myStudent. Teachers align their grading practices with the standards and grades are based on progress towards the standard
- Request a parent conference with the teacher(s). This can be on the phone or in person.
- Monitor scores on benchmark assessments like Florida Standards Assessments

Students earning any F's in Math, Science, Social Studies (Civics, US History), or English Language Arts each SEMESTER will be removed from elective courses and placed in Promotion Recovery to utilize the APEX Virtual Curriculum to remediate standards-based skills and recover credit for failed courses.
